La dolce vita

From the design-led Atelier collections by Ideal Standard, La Dolce Vita is a range created by the brand's chief design office's renowned Italian architect Roberto Palomba. The collection includes baths and shower fittings, basins, taps and accessories, balancing geometric shapes and forms. Inspired by nature: Vanity basin, £477; basin mixer in Chrome, £175; and Conca vanity in Matt Sunset, £750.



COLOUR STORY

These handmade zellige-style wall and floor tiles from Rutland London are made from terracotta in Spain using compaction techniques to enhance durability. Colours include Fennel Green, Archer Yellow and Butterfield Orange. They're available in a choice of formats, which can be fixed horizontally or vertically, in stripes or blocks of colour, or in any pattern. £240sq m for 40x110mm tiles.



ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN

This elegant bath is a bespoke piece, custom-made by Neutra for the Palm Flower luxury residential building in Dubai by Foster + Partners architects. The tub is designed to resemble a petal floating on water. Carved from a single block of Bianco Covelano marble, it has a polished surface, which encourages an interplay of light and shadow that accentuates its shape.



Smooth operator

A softer approach to crisply linear design is evident in the Tura collection by Roca, created in collaboration with Catalan designer Andreu Carulla. The 1000mm-wide basin features a hidden drain at the rear of the bowl, while the bath is lightweight yet generously proportioned. Basin, £712; and bath, £3,522.
